

# Royal St David's Golf Club

## **Joining the club**

A common misconception is that a club with the history and tradition of such an old established Championship link course as the Royal St David's is difficult to join, particularly if you are not known to a few members. If it is the case that you are not known to any of our members we will make special arrangement to introduce applicants to the club and its members.

## **How to Join**

Any prospective new Member requires a proposer and seconder, both of whom should have been Members of the Club for at least three years. Application forms are available from the Office, or to download a copy click this link (application form). The completed form should be sent to the Secretary accompanied by supporting letters from the proposer and seconder.

If you would like to apply for Royal St David's membership but do not know any members, please write or email The Secretary with your personal details including your current club and handicap and a supporting letter from your current club's Secretary.

If you are not currently a member of a recognised golf club then we would require you to submit an application with a supporting letter from an independent character witness and be interviewed at the club

## **Membership Categories**

### **Full Members**

Both Ladies and Men, must be age 18 or over. No restriction on playing rights.  
Full members are split into two categories

Category A is for members living within a radius of 45 miles from the clubhouse

Category B is for members living outside of the 45 mile radius

### **Lifestyle membership**

The club has introduced an experimental category for a two year period starting in July 2009. Under this scheme members will have playing rights restricted to non honours board competitions. It is effectively a play and pay category designed for members whose personal or domestic circumstances leave restricted time to play

### **Overseas Members**

Must be both currently resident and in full playing membership of a recognised Golf Club outside the UK. No restriction on playing rights

### **Junior Members**

Aged up to 12 and 12 to 18 may play golf at any time except before noon on weekends and public holidays. They may, by invitation, enter either the Club's competitions or those junior competitions open to their age.

### **House Members**

May use all of the Club's facilities, including the putting green, but must pay a full green fee when playing golf. House members may also use bars, restaurant and join the clubs function
